[ISRAEL] - THE SHMITA PROJECT Matan, United Way Israel is joining hands with businesses and the government to launch The Shmita Project, which will provide economic guidance and financial assistance educating families as how to budget, plan and provide for their homes to extricate thousands of families from the cycle of poverty. [ROMANIA] - SCHOOL AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

United Way Romania School after School program was extended to a new local school, thus increasing the number of assisted children to 120. The "School after School" was launched in October 2013 to help kids from lowincome families stay in school and complete their studies. Read more.



[POLAND] - FIRST BELL AT SCHOOL PROGRAM

Every year, United Way Poland collects within partner companies school supplies that are then distributed to children in need by volunteers. This action, called "First Bell at School" surpassed all expectations this year and benefitted more than 500 pupils. Read more.



[LIVERPOOL] - PLAY PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

The Play Partnership Program delivered 70 summer play programmes that focussed on healthy eating. In addition each scheme provided a direct help line to the local Citizens Advice Bureau. During the summer the Partnership was asked by Public Health Liverpool to set up a programme to help children in the Roma community and their families engage more with their local community. [FRANCE] - AIRBUS FLYING CHALLENGE

United Way France signed a new partnership with Les Petits Débrouillards, an organisation that works with children and teenagers to raise awairness on scientific, behavioral and environmental issues. They will lead workshops with Airbus co-workers and students withing the Airbus Flying Challenge program.



[ROMANIA] - LEARN TO SUCCEED PROGRAM

United Way Romania launched in September Mentoring & Tutoring activities, as part of its wider "Learn to Succeed" program. Over 80 volunteers were recruited to actively contribute to the children's success in school, help young adults and single mothers build up their self-esteem and prepare intensely to find a job.

[RUSSIA] - CHARITY GOLF CUP

United Way of Russia held the 12th edition of the Charity Golf Cup at Agalarov Golf & Country Club on August 29th 2014. The tournament was followed by a gala dinner and charity auction which helped raise money for homeless and refugees, elderly people, disabled children and other citizens of Russia being currently in need.

This event has become a traditional event for the business community. Every year about 120 golfers, 80 major companies and 60 individuals attend and support the tournament. More than 48 million rubles have been raised since the 1st edition.



[FRANCE] - WORLD CONVERGENCES FORUM

On September 8th and 9th, United Way France had a booth at the World Forum Convergences, the first platform for thought in Europe that aims at building new convergences between public, private, and solidarity-based actors to promote the Millennium Development Goals and to alleviate poverty and privation in developed and developing countries. United Way Poland co-organized the 7th OncoRun edition: 1080 runners covered 10 503 km (7780 laps) in total during this event, one of the biggest charity sport events in Poland. This edition saw Pawel Nastula, the Olympics champion, carry out professional warm ups, while Bloco Central and The Cookies provided live music. The amount collected during the run will be granted to oncologically ill people from Sarcoma Society
